World Mission Sunday is next Sunday, October 19. It is the one Sunday of the year when the Mass is celebrated exclusively for missionary activity. The second collections collected at these worldwide Masses go in their entirety to support churches, hospitals, schools and vocations in countries where the Church is new, young or poor. World Mission Sunday is our chance to show love and solidarity to our brothers and sisters overseas. In offering our prayers, we join with missionaries everywhere in communion and compassion to support them in spreading the Good News, and by giving a donation we respond to Christ's call to feed the hungry and clothe the naked.

At Immaculate Heart of Mary at the 5:30 pm Mass next Sunday, October 19, we will celebrate a multicultural Mass in our St. Gregory the Great Family of Parishes. Different ethnic groups will be represented. Mass will be in English, Spanish and Vietnamese among others. Join us for that Mission Celebration. Christmas can be a painful time for children with an incarcerated parent, the children's caregiver and the parent. Therefore, our SGG parish family is once again participating in the Angel Tree Project, whose purpose is to maintain and strengthen the bonds between a parent and child when the parent is incarcerated. Participants in the Angel Tree project are the link between the incarcerated parent and his or her children. We are scheduled to be assigned approximately 50 children living in the East Hamilton County and West Clermont County area. We will need volunteers to purchase and wrap gifts, deliver the gifts to the families' houses, and provide financial support. As in past years, we will continue to also provide a stocking and a hat for each of the children as well as a grocery gift card for the family.

I'm a member of a SGG spiritual support group. Initially, I joined a group to find ways to support my daughter during her time of challenges, and I found the group to be incredibly helpful. They offered ideas and encouragement, and they listened without judgment. Even though my daughter has since overcome her challenges with professional counseling, I continue attending for the ongoing encouragement and to navigate life's ups and downs. I also enjoy supporting fellow members; it's a rewarding experience.

In a mental wellness support group, when someone asks 'How are you doing?' they genuinely care. While they are not mental health professionals, facilitators are highly trained and provide a listening ear and share community resources. If you or a family member are facing mental health challenges, I highly recommend getting involved in one of the excellent support groups offered by the Mental Wellness Ministry. REMEMBER: You Don't Have to Be (or Walk) Alone!

Something Worth Thinking About

The Sign of the Cross is so much more than a gesture. Yes, it is a wonderful gesture and distinguishes us Catholics from Protestant denominations, but it is first and foremost a prayer in itself. Let's look at the history of the Sign of the Cross.

In the early Church, Christians would trace a small cross on their foreheads as a sign of their belonging to Christ. By the fourth century, the practice of making the Sign of the Cross began to evolve into something more formalized, with Christians marking themselves on the forehead, chest, and shoulders while invoking the Holy Trinity saying: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

The sign of the cross carries deep spiritual significance. It is a prayer which is:

- An invocation of the Holy Trinity
- A remembrance Christ's Passion
- A spiritual weapon—a prayer of protection
- An outward expression of one's inner faith
- A reminder of one's Baptism

What a profound prayer!

SGG Confirmation Prep

Our 2025-26 Confirmation Prep programs have begun for all SGG students. The programs for students in our parish schools have begun with the new "religion 'lab' " format, basically mirroring the agenda for the non-school program. They are taking roughly one class period each week to either engage in "discipleship" kinds of activities (ex: helping as "aids" to younger students, picking up trash on the school grounds, writing letters and/or making cards for various people in the community, learning about social justice causes, going to Adoration, praying the rosary, creating various prayer or spiritual enrichment crafts) or reporting on similar things they've done outside of school. Students not enrolled in our parish schools began their program on September 21st. Meeting roughly twice a month, 44 children are enrolled from all three parishes, reaching across seven different non-parish schools. As mentioned, they will be following the same basic schedule of topics and types of activities to deepen the experience of their faith walk. These children are having a great time becoming a new community of disciples within the SGG Family. Their goal is to "grow" their faith by following the acrostic G R O W (-W-W-W). Ask any of them what that stands for!
