## Reflections & Ryminations... by Fr. Steve Angi

The most important temple is the temple of a person's soul because God dwells within each one of us. In the most secret center of our being is that sacred sanctuary where we meet God. In addition to the temple of the soul, there are many sacred places throughout the world. There are shrines, churches, basilicas, grottos, cathedrals, and other holy places that are set aside for the sole purpose of worshiping God. They are to be a Heaven on earth. Today's feast of the Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran commemorates one such place, the most important church on earth.

In the city of Rome, there are four major basilicas. The first three are Saint Peter's Basilica in Vatican City, the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls, and the Basilica of Saint Mary Major. The fourth is the Archbasilica Cathedral of the Most Holy Savior and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist in the Lateran, also called Saint John Lateran, or the Lateran Basilica for short. Of the four major basilicas, the oldest and most important is Saint John Lateran. Though the pope lives in the Apostolic Palace next to Saint Peter's Basilica, Saint John Lateran is the official cathedral of Rome. That means Saint John Lateran is not only the mother church of the Archdiocese of Rome but also the mother church of the entire world.

Though the basilica was first dedicated to Christ the Savior, in the tenth century Pope Sergius III added a new baptistry and rededicated the basilica to Saint John the Baptist. In the twelfth century, Pope Lucius II dedicated the basilica to Saint John the Evangelist. The basilica, therefore, honors Christ the Savior first and the two Saint Johns as the co-patrons. Though the Lateran Basilica has remained the pope's cathedral from the time of its dedication, the Lateran Palace, next to the Basilica, was the papal residence for a period of time before being moved to Vatican Hill.

As we honor the mother church of the whole world today, we must remember a church is sacred because it is exclusively dedicated to the worship of God. It is the pope's cathedral from which the entire Church is governed and the central place of worship for the world. As we honor the dedication of this Cathedral today, pray for the Church. Pray for your local parish, religious institutions, religious orders, dioceses, and the Universal Church governed in Rome. Our churches and sacred places exist to be places where we come to encounter God. Pray for Pope Leo XIV today, that Saint John Lateran will always be a place where he, and every pope after him, will encounter God in a profound way.

#### **Charitable Donation Strategies**


It's already November, which means the end of the year will be here before you know it. That also means the window of opportunity to make a financial contribution for the 2025 tax year is closing rapidly. Donations made by cash or check are by far the most common methods of charitable giving. Contributing stocks, bonds, or mutual funds that have appreciated over time, however, has become increasingly popular, and for good reasons. Here are some ways to lower your taxes and shift your taxable income to a charitable donation to benefit Guardian Angels, Immaculate Heart of Mary, or St. John Fisher.

#### **Outright Gift of Stock**

Make a gift by transferring (not selling) stock directly to Guardian Angels, Immaculate Heart of Mary, or St. John Fisher, avoid paying capital gains on the transfer, and receive a tax-saving charitable deduction for the market value of the stock as of the date of the transfer.

#### IRA Charitable Rollover (Qualified Charitable Distribution)

If you are 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  or older, in 2025 you can transfer up to \$108,000 from your



#### **Donor Advised Fund**

Make a tax-deductible gift of stock to a donor advised fund, which gives you the ability to make grants to GA, IHM, or SJF this year and in future years. Talk to your financial advisor about establishing a donor-advised fund.

#### Catholic Education Foundation SGO Program Donors May Be Eligible for an Ohio Tax Credit

The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati (CEF) is certified by Ohio as a scholarship-granting organization (SGO). Ohio taxpayers who donate to SGOs may be able to claim a dollar-for-dollar, non-refundable tax credit on their state income tax return for up to \$750 per donor (up to \$1,500 if married and filing jointly). This is a tax credit, not a deduction. For any amount you donate up to the limit, your tax bill is reduced by that exact amount.

Donations to the CEF-SGO can be designated to benefit a specific school(s). Both Guardian Angels and Immaculate Heart of Mary schools are eligible for these donations, and they provide more educational options for students.

#### **Finding Inner Peace Through Prayer**

Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." John 14:27 (St. Joseph ed., New American Bible)

Searching for inner peace? A few minutes a day in prayer can provide the peace that the Lord offers. Research shows that prayer can help reduce anxiety, increase emotional resilience, and provide comfort, strength, hope and connection.


It is often helpful to:

- Plan time for prayer every day.
- Find a quiet place away from distractions.
- Take some slow deep breaths.
- Hold an object or gaze at an image to help you stay focused.

And, try any of these ways to pray.

- Repeat a simple phrase such as "Jesus, I trust in You."
- Recite a prayer or say a Rosary. Find Catholic resources online or in apps.
- Express your thoughts and feelings.
- Ask for guidance, help, healing or comfort for yourself and others.
- Reflect on scripture.
- Be silent. Listen for God's word.
- Focus on being grateful, give thanks and praise.
- Start a prayer journal.

## **FAITH FORMATION & EVANGELIZATION**

In today's Gospel (John 2:13-22), we encounter a very different side of Jesus. Have you ever thought about the different sides of Him? Many of us grew up with the image of Jesus holding a lamb and sitting with children. Yet today, we see Him angry—really angry.

This story reminds us just how human Jesus was. While He is fully God and fully man (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraphs 464-467), we sometimes forget that He experienced all human emotions. Imagine coming home to find the Findlay Marketplace set up in your front yard instead of its normal place downtown. You'd be pretty upset too, right? Jesus reacts similarly, clearing out those who were disrespecting His Father's house.

But it goes deeper than this. As Catholics, we believe we are living tabernacles, with the presence of God dwelling within us every time we partake in the Eucharist. Yet, after leaving church, we often let sins and vices creep into our hearts. Jesus is ZEALOUS for you and fights to keep your heart safe—not in a possessive way, but like a loving husband protecting his wife from harm. Jesus is dedicated to you and will not stop fighting until you belong to Him alone.

I know that sounds intense, but Jesus was an intense man. Just reread the passage! He was all in, all the time, and He asks us to be the same in our lives today. When you struggle with habitual sin (and we all do), remember that we have a Savior who is zealously fighting for us. He will help you clear out the vendors and money changers cluttering your heart so you can enter more deeply into a relationship with Him.

In closing, I'd like to offer a simple challenge: Go to Confession. Jesus is fighting to keep you clean and safe, but you must accept that help. It's not enough to clear out an invader; you need to change the locks and repair what is broken. Going to Confession allows Jesus to heal the brokenness in your heart and start anew. So please, make your way to Confession this week and let Jesus make you clean.



#### St. Gregory the Great Family Pilgrimage to Italy

As many of you know, a group of 37 of us from St. Gregory the Great left on pilgrimage at the beginning of October to Assisi, Rome, and other locations in central Italy. Since 2025 is the Jubilee Year of Hope, our primary purpose was to journey to the Holy Doors of St. Peter's Basilica in prayer, but there were so many other incredible blessings and opportunities along the way. In Assisi, we prayed at the tombs of St. Francis of Assisi, St. Clare, and one of our newest Saints, Carlo Acutis. We prayed in beautiful churches large and small, from the stunning Duomo in Siena to small churches in villages throughout Tuscany. Each of us had a prayer partner on the trip with us that we prayed for, as well as our personal petitions and the petitions from all the parishioners in our Family of Parishes. We were also able to have Mass every day in some stunning places: beautiful Baroque churches, right below the original San Damiano Crucifix that spoke to St. Francis of Assisi, in the Roman Catacombs where early Christians hid to celebrate the Sacraments, and of course Sunday Mass in St. Peter's Square with Pope Leo presiding. I was also blown away by how blessed we were and how good the Father was to us. We were able to have Mass right in front of St. Francis of Assisi's tomb (which I found out later is very hard to get). In Orvieto, where one of the most famous Eucharistic Miracles in history happened, usually the relic from the miracle is only open for veneration 4 days throughout the year. However, the local bishop made an exception and placed it for veneration the very day we were driving through, and we were able to celebrate Mass in that chapel. At Mass with Pope Leo, they brought the statue of Our Lady of Fatima from Portugal to be right next to the Altar. These and so many other incredible opportunities were further evidence of how good of a God we have. And of course, we had great food, gelato, and wine. Spectacular views. Perfect weather. And building up friendships and relationships among each other. Some of the highlights are pictured below; more to come in next week's bulletin. On behalf of all of us who went on the pilgrimage, know that we prayed for all of you and your intentions. Thank you for your prayers for us. And may we continue forward through the rest of this year and the rest of our lives in a strong and abiding spirit of hope: a hope rooted in Christ and in His eternal victory over all sin and evil. 
