# Reflections & Ryminations... by Fr. Steve Angi

In the pastor's column this weekend, I have asked Fr. Aaron to reflect on the pilgrimage to Italy with members of our Family of Parishes. His reflection follows:

Both last week and this week, I shared some photos and reflections on our pilgrimage to Italy. As I said there, it was an incredibly prayerful opportunity for all of us. But I wanted to share a little of my own personal reflection from the trip. In the days leading up to our departure, I had been asking the Lord what He wanted to show me through this pilgrimage, and I kept coming back to the simple yet profound reflection: God wanted to just be a father to me. I need to allow myself to be a son, to receive the gifts from His generous love. So that became my prayer throughout the week: Lord, let me be open to your generosity.

And it did not take long for God to respond. I randomly found St. Carlo Acutis within half an hour of arriving at Assisi and got to pray with him on my own. This was my first time as a priest overseas, and so being able not just to attend but to celebrate Masses in such incredible locations was a gift. God was very good to me. But there was one gift that I think was very "tailored" to me, at least in my mind. I have always enjoyed music in many different forms. I've especially come to love playing and listening to the organ. So one evening, we were scheduled to join a group of Benedictine monks at 5:30 for chanted Vespers, the evening prayers of the Church. We arrived at the Abbey, said Mass, and then found out that Vespers actually started at 6:30, meaning we had an extra hour to wander the peaceful grounds and pray on our own. I was walking around the church to get to another section when suddenly organ music came spilling out of the church. Someone had started practicing on the instrument, right when we had free time, and right when I walked by the open door. So I went into the church, took a seat, and ended up spending the remainder of that hour in prayer, surrounded by the beauty of this Italian Abbey church and the beautiful organ music. I was one of the few from our group that got to soak in this incredible experience, and it was so tailored to what brings me joy. It was a perfect gift from the Father to me, His son.

I think that has been the biggest takeaway for me personally from this trip: God wants to spoil us, His children. He is such a generous and loving God, and He wants to pour out more and more graces upon us. Quite often, though, we are not ready or willing to ask. Or we are looking in the wrong places. Or, when a gift is given, we brush it off as coincidence. And all too often, we don't return to God in gratitude for the gifts we receive.

We are closing in upon the Holiday season, a time of gifts and thankfulness. I encourage all of you during this time to open your hearts to God's unexpected gifts that He wants to give you. Do not be afraid to ask. Be open to how He is going to respond, because it probably is not going to be what you expect, and you could miss them when they arrive. But once you do receive it, soak it in, accept the love of the Father, and relish the fact that you are a loved treasure in the eyes of the Lord of the Universe. And He finds great joy in you and in your joy.

## **Spotlight on SGG's Youth Ministry Programs**

We have two phenomenal Youth Ministers who tag-team our two Youth Groups:

**Middle School** – Alex Bodenschatz leads the 6th – 8th graders in what I like to call "Balls and Bible talk". Between our pool table, our ping pong table, 10 Pepper Pong sets, our 9 Square set, and our new "Pop-A-Shot", we find lots of ways to "bounce" ideas off one another about those games AND how Jesus shows us how to have fun and win in the game of life by way of His teachings in the Bible.

**High School** – Alison Richert leads our 9th through 12th graders in weekly sessions that go beyond the bouncing balls. The older teens are more into deeper dives on relevant topics in their lives: how to manage the stresses and anxiety of life, what does "discipleship" look like, how to enrich their faith experience, and how to be "in" the world but not "of" it, among others. We typically end each session with our own "bouncing ball" contest: an always rousing game of "Ricochet"!

**BONUS: LifePREP** – Steve Von Hoene is heading up our first year with this super cool "teen life skills" program. Ultimately it will be three levels: "100" for 8th graders, "200" for 9th and 10th graders, and "300" for 11th and 12th graders. Teens brainstorm a list of 100 Dreams. We then pick one they can likely accomplish within the next 6-8 months. They then meet monthly as a group to talk about progress and strategies to accomplish their dreams, while learning key life skills along the way. They follow those meetings up with 1:1 meetings with a "Teen Life Coach" (TLC) who they've chosen to work with them on the various elements in the program. Monthly "FYI" meetings are also held for the Parents and Coaches.




